



PUBLIC NOTICE

REGISTRATION AND LICENSING OF ENGINEERING PRACTITIONERS, FIRMS, AND EDUCATIONAL UNITS

The general public and all engineering practitioners are hereby informed that the Engineering Council, pursuant to the Engineering Council Act, 2011 (Act 819), is mandated to regulate the practice of engineering in Ghana.

In accordance with Section 13 of the Act, no person shall practice engineering or offer engineering services unless duly registered by the Engineering Council. Accordingly, the Council is responsible for the registration of engineering practitioners, firms, and educational units offering engineering programmes in the country.

Further, Section 14 of the Act requires that all engineering practitioners be certified by a licensed body prior to registration with the Council. Practitioners are therefore directed to liaise with their respective licensed bodies, the Ghana Institution of Engineering (GhIE) or the Institution of Engineering and Technology, Ghana (IET-GH), to ensure they are in good standing and duly registered by the Engineering Council by 27th February 2026.

The registers of practitioners, firms, and educational units in good standing will be published on the Engineering Council website (www.engcouncil.gov.gh) and in the Gazette.

This notice is issued to all stakeholders and the general public to take note of the registration requirements under Engineering Council Act, 2011 (Act 819) and Engineering Council Regulation, 2020 (L.I. 2410).

Note: Practicing engineering or endorsing engineering documents without registration is an offence with associated sanctions as outlined under Section 44 of the Engineering Council Act, 2011 (Act 819).
