# Our Approach to the Study

Sampled Ghanaians across all 16 regions

Deployed Our Instrument to 300,000 eligible voters via bulk SMS (April 9-11, 2026)

Regions with more voters got higher samples relative to regions with a smaller number of voters.

Responses to the survey were purely voluntary.

A total of 6796 responses were received at the close of polls

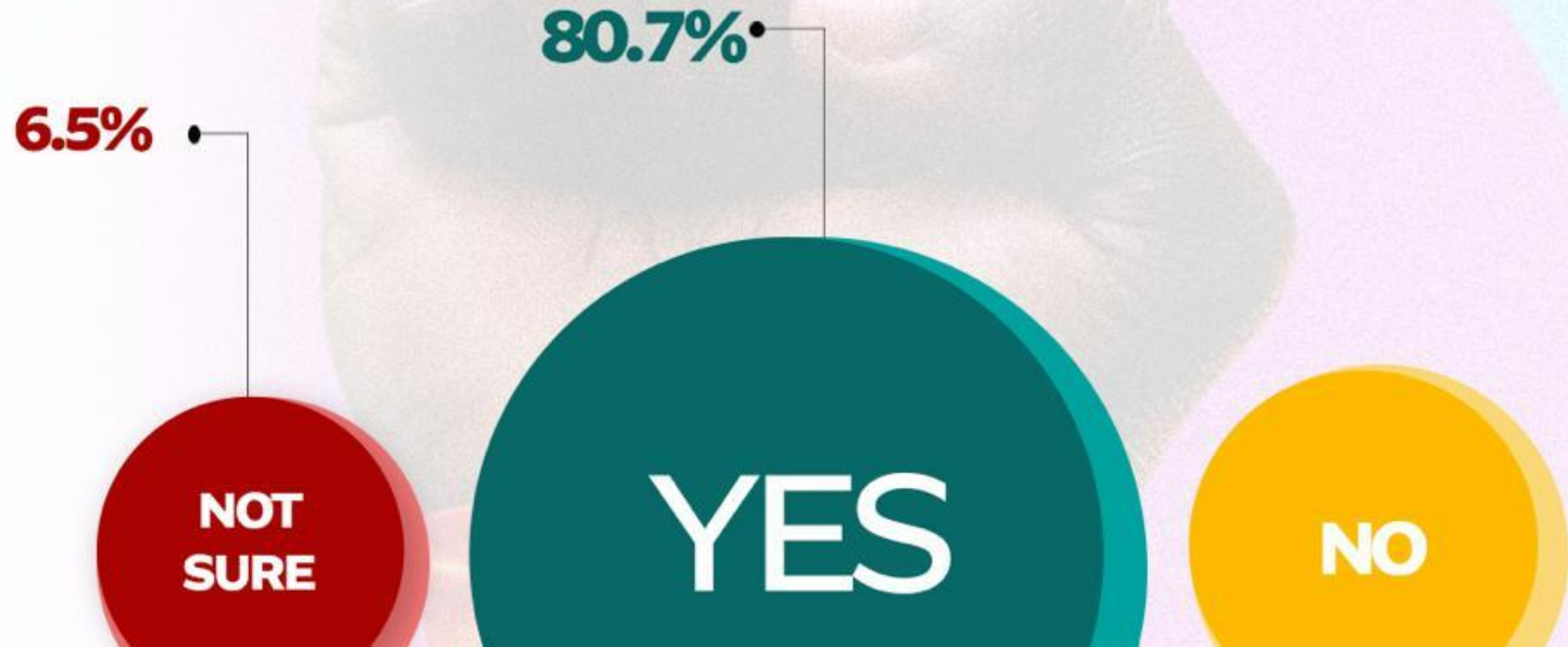

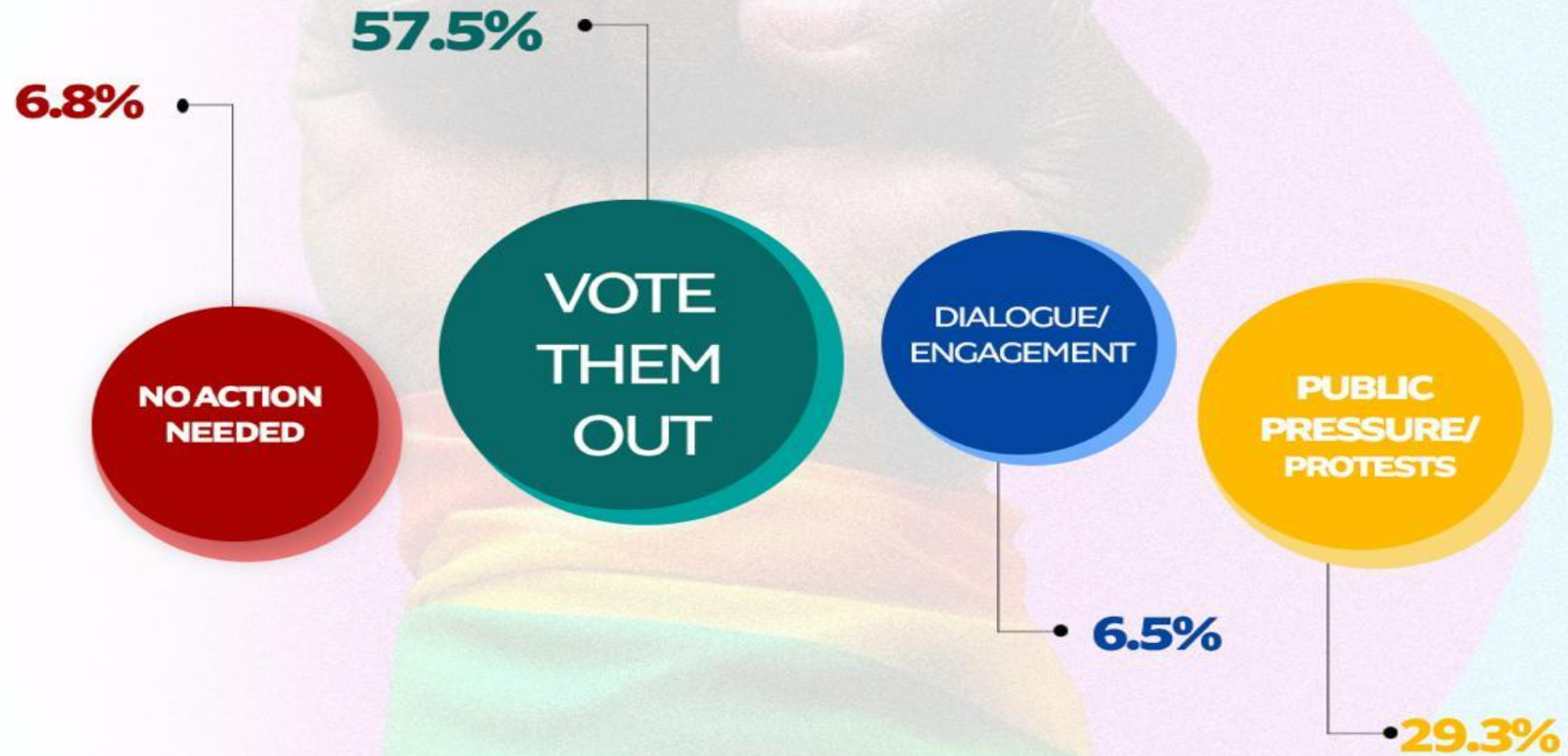

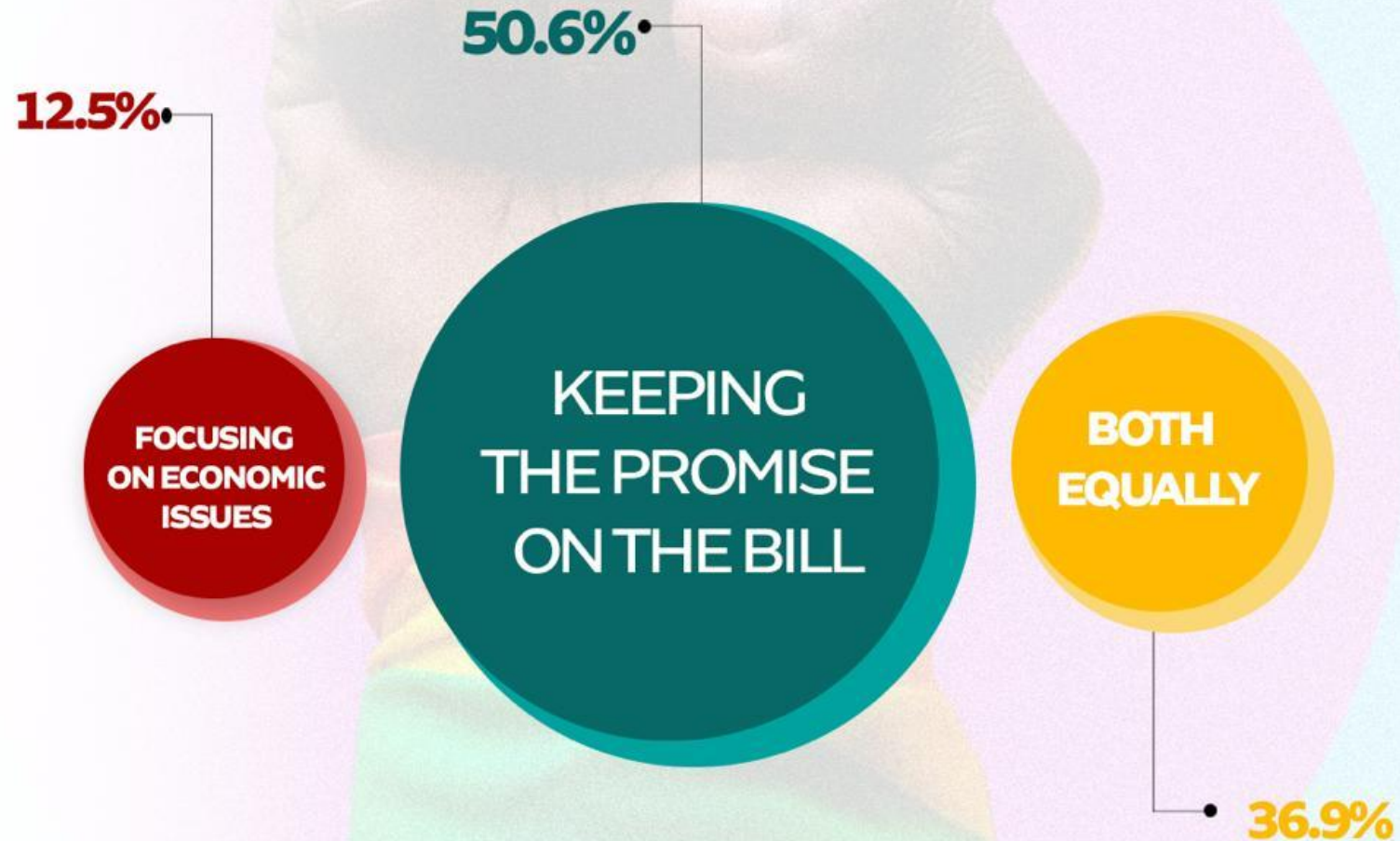
Should **failure to sign** the LGBTQ+ bill influence how you vote in future elections?



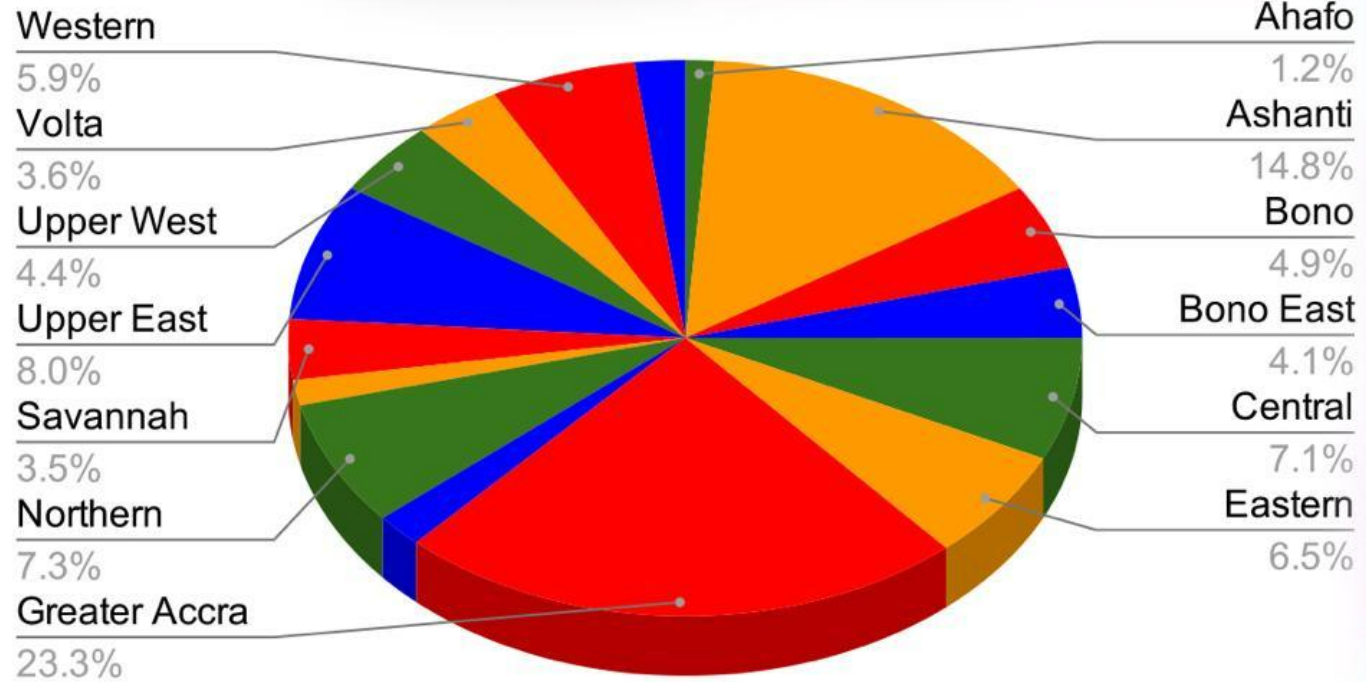
## What should happen if the Government fail to act on the LBGTQ+ bill?



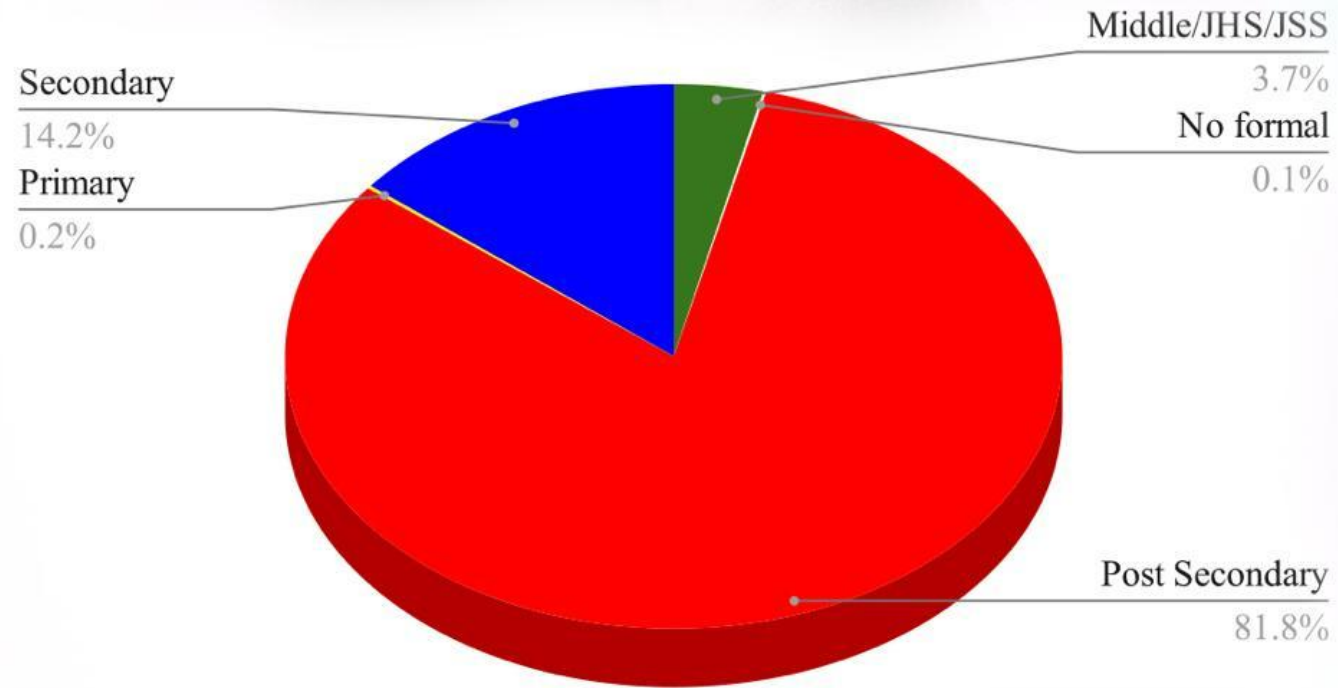
Which matters more to you right now?  
**Priority vs Promise**



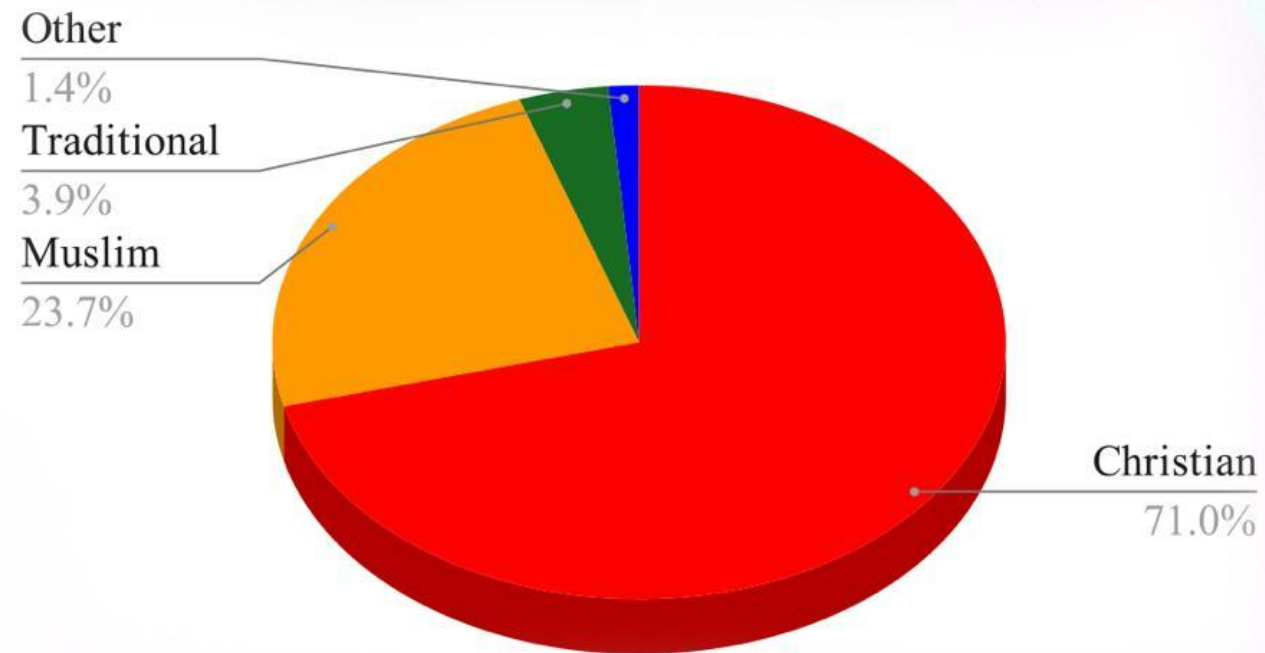
