We, the women of Ghana, drawn from political parties, markets, salons, dressmaking shops, offices and homes, are coming together to demand justice, equality, dignity and the protection of our constitutional rights.

The Ghana Women's Movement is deeply concerned about the increasing intimidation, arrests, remand and imprisonment of Ghanaian women in connection with the exercise of their freedom of expression.

Women cannot remain silent while other women are arrested, detained and imprisoned for speaking their minds.

OUR MESSAGE

Ghanaian women have voices.

We will not accept a situation where women are made to feel that speaking their minds comes at the price of intimidation, arrest or imprisonment.

The petition will set out the concerns of Ghanaian women and our demands for dignity, equality, freedom of expression, women's empowerment and equal treatment.

The full contents of the petition will be presented directly to the Vice President.

1. STOP THE INTIMIDATION AND ARRESTS OF GHANAIAAN WOMEN

Women must be free to speak.

Women must be free to participate in politics.

Women must be free to criticise the government.

Women must be free to demand accountability.

2. FULL IMPLEMENTATION OF THE AFFIRMATIVE ACTION LAW

We call for the full implementation of the Affirmative Action (Gender Equity) Act, 2024, including measures to increase women's representation and participation in decision-making.
