CHOPSS RELEASES 2026 LIST OF PRIVATE SECOND-CYCLE SCHOOLS IN GOOD STANDING

Accra, September 7, 2026 -The Conference of Heads (Proprietors) of Private Second-Cycle Schools (CHOPSS) has published its 2026 list of member schools in good standing, covering private second-cycle institutions across several regions of Ghana.

The publication is intended to provide parents, guardians, students and the general public with information on private second-cycle schools affiliated with the Conference and recognised as members in good standing for the 2026 academic year.

The schools on the list are spread across the Ahafo, Ashanti, Bono, Bono East, Central, Eastern, Greater Accra, Northern, Oti, Upper East, Upper West, Volta, Western and Western North Regions.

Other regions represented on the list include Northern, Oti, Upper East, Upper West, Volta, Western and Western North, demonstrating the presence of private second-cycle institutions affiliated with CHOPSS across the country.

PROGRAMMES OFFERED

The schools listed provide a broad range of second-cycle programmes. These include General Arts, General Science, Business, Home Economics, Visual Arts, Agricultural Science and Technical programmes.

Some institutions also offer specialised technical and applied programmes, including Electrical Engineering, Automobile Engineering, Building Construction Technology, Electronics and related technical courses.

The list further indicates that some schools provide a wider combination of programmes, including STEM, Computer Science, Information Technology, Biomedical Science, Languages and Global Studies.
